Puppets for Christ Spaghetti Dinner is Back!!!





Asbury Service Project Update

Ruth lives alone in the home where she and her husband raised their children near Mountain City, TN. In declining health, and unsteady on her feet, Ruth manages with help from friends and extended family. Financially, she receives enough to meet her basic needs, but not much more. Ruth has experienced a great deal of tragedy in her life; the bodies of her husband and two sons are buried in her front yard. Despite her circumstances, Ruth remains upbeat and loves to talk to anyone who visits.



Her home, while basically sound, had a few deficiencies that made it challenging for Ruth to move about safely. Unable to afford home repairs, Ruth has managed as best she can, and has fallen more than a few times. This past June, one of your ASP work teams spend the better part of a week at Ruth's home, stabilizing her basement stairs and constructing an outdoor walkway to provide her with safe passage from her house to her driveway. Beyond that, the team spent time with Ruth, getting to know her and showing her that the Body of Christ cares for her.

This was the experience of one of the five work teams that you sponsored in mission to Appalachia this year. It is a mission of making homes warmer, safer and drier, but moreover it is a mission of sharing Christ's love in relationship with his children. "Feed my lambs."

Pancake breakfasts are back! Our first breakfast in nearly two years took place on Sunday, November 14. The turnout was fabulous, demonstrating once again the support of this wonderful congregation for the ASP mission. Pancake breakfasts are scheduled each month through April. We look forward to seeing you there.

We have also resumed our local service activities, which include serving dinners once each month at the Christian Shelter and building wheelchair ramps, in partnership with Chesapeake Housing Mission. Our first ramp build took place on October 23, and our remaining builds are scheduled for:

March 19 April 9 May 7

There is still room for our group to grow. Registration for high school students and their parents remains open through December 31. Thank you, Asbury, for your continued support of this longstanding ministry!

Dear Faith Family,

In 2022 Asbury will be offering 4X4 groups as a way to help us commit to connecting in community and Christ (see graphic at right). (A church that is used for building community is fellowship.) Here's the deal with 4x4s:

- 1. Beginning in January, Interested parties sign up by checking "4x4" box on the connection card. Easy peasy.
- 2. 4 households will be assigned to each group and notified. Households can be married couples, single folks, families—any combination of people living in the same home.
- 3. The goal is to build relationships by meeting once a month for 4 months with your 4x4. Then we switch groups to get to build community and fellowship with more folks. (You can opt out at any time.)
- 4. To start, one household in each 4x4 will be assigned to plan the first month's get together, then it is up to each group to decide how to proceed with each month's activities. This can literally be anything that involves coming together in any way. In person is best, but sometimes there are limitations. **The point of this is simply to be together—fellowship.** No books, lessons, or agenda! How about game night, a meal, a walk, a bonfire, an outing to an event—the sky is the limit!
- 5. Fear not, introverts! These 4x4s are small in size and meant to be quite informal and relaxed. If you would like some tips, I am happy to send you an article *The introvert's guide to community* (written by an introvert—so not me!).
- 6. Introverts and extroverts—there are many benefits of 4x4s. You get to:
 - a. explore relationships with many folks, but in doable, organized, small chunks
 - b. deepen relationships with those you click with
 - c. get to know & learn about those you may not click with as well
 - d. <u>be an active participant in building community in your church—intergenerationally and</u> across all worship services. What an opportunity! You are a rock star!!!



Which brings us to January's spiritual practice—SURPRISE-It's fellowship! It's almost like this was planned to go together...In case my excitement did not come through, I strongly encourage you to sign up for a 4x4. Other suggestions-Make a commitment to:

-attend worship every Sunday you are in town (worship is its own spiritual discipline and can lead into fellowship)

-join an adult Sunday School class (we have three to pick from!)

-join at least one temporary small group this year

-start a small group around a topic that you are passionate about or want to learn alongside others about

If you already participate in some or all of these, pray about where God is leading you in terms of fellowship here at Asbury. If it would help to share your commitment with another person to increase accountability I'm your gal (your specific commitment to the practice of fellowship, that is—I am happily married lol)! Of course if you have questions or want to bounce some ideas, I am here for you, friends.




The next study will be Growing Older and Wiser by Sandy and Dale Larsen, a LifeGuide Bible study.


