
Asbury Child Development Center

If you need registration information please call 410-742-7058 to schedule a pickup time. If you have additional questions do not hesitate to contact anyone in the office. Thank you!




Dear Church Family,

Rehearsals have begun for the musical production, Godspell. Performances will be in Fellowship Hall on Friday, April 8 at 7:30 PM and Saturday, April 9 at 2:00 PM & 7:30 PM. Please mark your calendars to attend this exciting and meaningful show centered around the Gospel of St. Matthew, in which Jesus preaches through parables and storytelling. The show uses things such as clowning, pantomime, charades, acrobatics to tell the story of Jesus. The music selections vary in style and feature solos, duets, and company.

Godspell opened at the Cherry Lane Theater in New York City on May 17, 1971 and was an immediate hit with audiences. Because the theater was not

large enough to meet audience demands, the show was moved to the Promenade Theater where it had 2, 124 performances. It eventually moved to Broadway in 1976, where it ran another 527 shows.

Just follow the on-screen prompts.

(**NOTE:** Web signups will be routinely locked out every week for 48 hours, from midnight Friday to midnight Sunday, to avoid potential conflicts with in-person reservations. Paper signup sheets will be available in the Welcome Center every Sunday to allow folks to register the old-fashioned way if they prefer.)


First Friday Youth Group



Asbury Service Project Update



Flexibility (adj) 1. Capable of being bent, usually without breaking. 2. Willing or disposed to yield; pliable. The ASP experience, and the trip in particular, demands flexibility. A project to replace flooring turns into floor joist replacements. Removing shingles for a roof job reveals rotten sheathing and rafters, which require immediate attention. A planned spot for a wheelchair ramp post is discovered to have a water pipe running through it. And so it goes; we make plans and then figure out how to adapt to the situation.

Such is the case for most of our lives these past two years. We were blessed to have the opportunity to resume pancake breakfasts in November and December, only to pump the brakes in January due to the latest surge. We are most grateful for our church family's support at the two breakfasts and look forward to serving you once again when the surge abates.

In the meantime, we continue to prepare dinners for the Christian Shelter once each month and plan to resume wheelchair ramp builds in partnership with Chesapeake Housing Mission in the spring. Ramp builds are scheduled for:

outstanding volunteer work at Asbury. Congratulations, Tracy! Tracy's husband and mother surprised her as she received her flower bouquet and award.




Open Hearts Open Minds
