Trom the desk of PASTOR TOM PASMORE

I pray that your autumn has been one of wonder, love, and hopefully engagement. Where is God calling you to step in, step up, or step aside??? As you pray about this, I wanted to share this article by Seth Godin. Seth is a marketer by training, but he is a prophet by practice. Here he talks about belief versus faith versus certainty.

Faith makes us human. Belief is our tool to dance with a possible future, confront our fears, and build community. Our personal taste and our preferences belong to us as well, helping us believe in ourselves and have faith.

For millennia, faith thrived in most parts of our lives. We didn't need faith to know that fire was hot (it always is), but it certainly gave us hope and solace in the face of the unknown. And the unknown is where faith lives.

But resistance to knowing isn't a useful habit. When Ignaz Semmelweis used statistics to prove that hand washing by doctors would save the lives of mothers giving birth, doctors who had faith that they knew better ignored it, causing countless deaths. When researchers showed that many ulcers are caused by bacteria, doctors who practiced with long-earned belief resisted the data for decades. And when experts in any field fight against research that might undermine their status, they're doing both their faith and the people who trust them a disservice.

There's more proof in the world than ever before, not less. It's no longer, "I'll believe it when I see it," but instead, "I am confident enough to change my mind and informed enough to do the math and understand the concepts." We have proof about mathematics, about black holes and about the efficacy of vaccines. We have statistical proof of what people click on and how humans respond in a double-blind test.

This doesn't make faith less important. In fact, as proof shows up in one area, it simply gives us the opportunity to bring faith somewhere else, somewhere we can put it to good use. Personal taste, placebos and the way we dance with the unknown future are powerful ways to connect, to express ourselves and to find solace.

But the time we spend arguing about proof that we're not prepared to accept is simply wasted. Faith needs proof the way a fish needs a bicycle.

But we all need faith, belief, and proof. May we be students of the great teacher and live in both faith and certainty.


We currently have several building projects scheduled in the future, most notably wheelchair ramps with Chesapeake Housing Mission. No experience or tools necessary; we will train and equip you.

October's Spiritual Practice

This month we will be focusing on a conversational relationship with Jesus. Really, we are talking about prayer. However, our prayer time often turns into a laundry list of repetition and things we want from God. There is nothing wrong with asking—God indeed wants us to ask! But, petition is only a portion of what prayer is. Anything we are feeling and sharing with God is prayer. And, God can take all of our emotions—rage, grief, disillusionment, and whatever else we emote. Remember, God knows our hearts. Telling God how we are feeling doesn't give God *information*, but greater access to our deepest selves.

Our practice this month, "Pull up a Chair," is a way to remind ourselves that not only is Jesus present with us, but that he is our friend. And, just like we would hang out with a friend, we

can sit and "chew the fat" with Jesus. Having a chair nearby is a tangible reminder that Jesus is with us and that he is listening (if there is no chair available or you don't wish to get a physical chair, feel free to "pull up a chair" figuratively). Our friendship with Jesus is the most important relationship in our lives.

After you "pull up a chair," the goal is to speak aloud about your feelings, wonderings, worries, ideas, passing thoughts, just like you would if your earthly bestie was sitting in that chair. When we speak out loud, it helps to keep us on track and stay out of our heads. This doesn't mean you have to talk the entirety of your time. Treat it like any other conversation with a friend. Every so often, pause to see if you sense a response.

End your time with some silence to listen with your heart. Sit and reflect or journal your thoughts about what you encountered. Remember, even if you do not sense anything or feel differently, no time spent with God is ever wasted! The point of spiritual practices is to make space for God to transform us.

P.S. If you would like some structure, set a timer for 5 minutes (or whatever amount of time you feel is appropriate). Blessed chatting!

You are invited to attend a silent retreat Saturday Oct 21 from 10-4. This is the perfect opportunity to dip your toe into the silent retreat experience. We will end at 3 with worship and a time of debrief. All are welcome!

SHERIFF LEWIS TO SPEAK

On Sunday, October 1, Wicomico County Sheriff Mike Lewis will be the featured speaker at the next Lunch & Learn program sponsored by the Church & Society committee. Sheriff Lewis will address the recent string of street shootings in Salisbury, as well as mental health issues and other challenges confronting youth in our community.

Our goal is to understand why this outbreak of violence seems to be flaring right now, and to hear what role we at Asbury might be able to play in responding to it and strengthening our community.
